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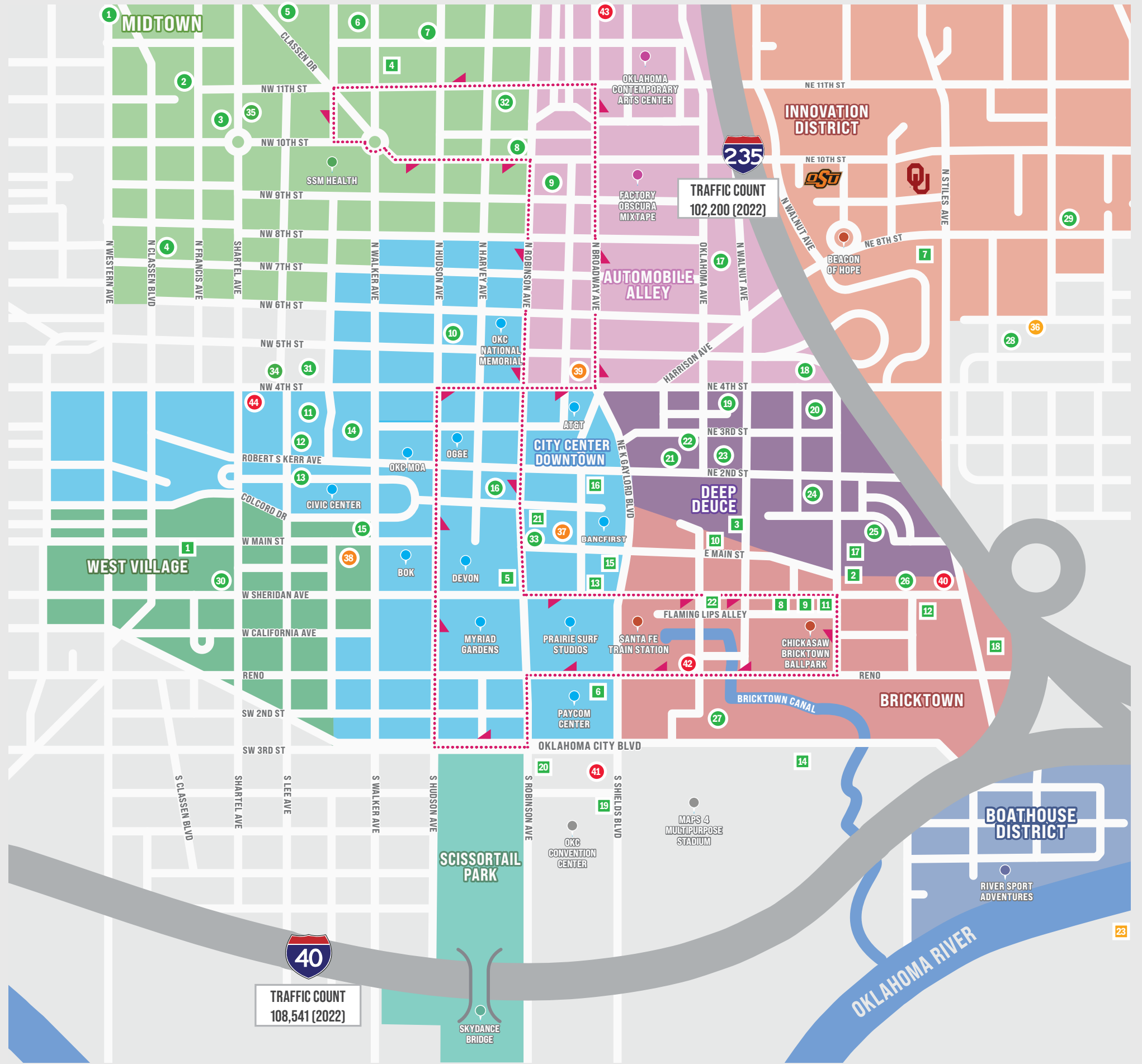

DOWNTOWN OKC THIS DECADE

Oklahoma City started the decade with a new landscape as many game-changing projects have recently come to fruition in the city's core.

- A new \$1-billion downtown arena that will be the home of the **Oklahoma City Thunder**.
- **OKANA** is a \$300-million indoor waterpark. The resort will also feature a riverfront hotel, amphitheater, restaurants and retail.
- **Scissortail Park** is a 70-acre, fully programmed downtown park.
- The **First Americans Museum (FAM)** celebrates our shared history through the collective stories of 39 distinct tribal nations in Oklahoma today.
- A \$277-million **Oklahoma City Convention Center**.
- A new 605-room headquarters hotel operated by **Omni Hotel & Resorts**.
- The **Oklahoma City Streetcar** connects all these amenities to the rest of downtown.



WHAT IS MAPS?

Metropolitan Area Projects (MAPS) is Oklahoma City's pay-as-you-go, temporary-sales-tax, capital investment program. Downtown has attracted more than \$7 billion in public and private investment since the original MAPS projects.

MAPS I (1993) - \$363-million package, nine projects including:

- Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark
- Bricktown Canal
- Oklahoma River
- Chesapeake Energy Arena

MAPS for Kids (2001) - \$700-million package that renovated or rebuilt every school in Oklahoma City limits.

MAPS 3 (2009) - \$777-million package, eight projects including:

- Modern Streetcar
- Whitewater rafting facility
- A new convention center
- 70-acre Scissortail Park

MAPS 4 (2019) - \$1.1-billion package, 16 projects including:

- Investment in OKC's Innovation District
- Multipurpose outdoor stadium
- Beautification of key corridors
- 70% of package will be dedicated to neighborhood and human needs
